



# RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

**Name:** Michael Banks

**Criminal history:** Convicted in 1985 on nine counts of robbery, kidnapping with the use of a firearm and attempted robbery. Convicted in 1992 on two counts of robbery armed with a machine gun. Now serving 25-years-to-life after being convicted of cocaine and marijuana possession for sale.

**Proposition 66 release date:** Under Proposition 66, Mr. Banks’ sentence would be reduced to a maximum of five years, eight months. Because of time served and “good time” credits, would be eligible for release in 2006.
