



# RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

**Name:** John Bunyard — “The Nob Hill Rapist”

**Criminal history:** A violent career criminal and sexual predator. Convicted of ten felonies since 1955. Murdered two women during a crime spree in 1973. Also kidnapped, raped, robbed and assaulted several other women from San Francisco to Lake Tahoe. Sentenced to 19 years in prison, released. Convicted in 1992 for possession of a billy club, placed on probation. Four years later, offered a 14-year-old girl money so he could “look” at her. Arrested and convicted of attempting to commit a lewd and lascivious act on a minor. Now serving 28 years to life.

**Proposition 66 release date:** Under Proposition 66, Mr. Bunyard’s sentence would be reduced to a maximum of three years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, he would be eligible for immediate release.
