



RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

Name: Rudolph Casillas

Criminal history: Strangled former girlfriend (the mother of his child) until she was unconscious, leaving her for dead. Returned two days later, warned the woman that he would be “judge, jury and executioner if I am arrested.” Has eight prior strike convictions, in addition to prior convictions for commercial burglary, resisting arrest, spousal abuse, two separate convictions for possession of heroin, felon in possession of a firearm and grand theft. Now serving 25 years to life.

Proposition 66 release date: Under Proposition 66, Mr. Casillas’ sentence would be reduced to a maximum of eight years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, he would be eligible for immediate release.
