



# RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

**Name:** Eugene Alexander Dey

**Criminal history:** Convicted in 1984 of driving the get-away car during an armed robbery, in which a sawed-off shotgun was used. Convicted of assault with a deadly weapon in 1986 after slashing a juvenile across the chest with a knife, requiring 200 stitches. Convicted of first-degree burglary in 1987, convicted of burglary again in 1988. Most recently convicted of drug possession after officers found methamphetamine and marijuana, a “pay-owe” ledger, a scale and knives in his car after stopping him for driving without current registration tags. At the time, he told officers “I’m not a drug dealer, I just sell drugs to support my habit.” Currently serving 25 years to life.

**Proposition 66 release date:** Under Proposition 66, Mr. Dey’s sentence would be reduced to a maximum of three years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, he would be eligible for immediate release.
