



RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

Name: Salvador Garcia

Criminal history: Criminal history began at 18. Arrested for forcible rape when 23, conviction reduced to assault. Convicted of murder and robbery in 1972. Record includes 18 convictions for public intoxication, nine DUIs, leaving the scene of an accident, fleeing from police and three drug-related offenses. Currently serving 25 years to life after being convicted of escape, felony possession of a firearm and assault.

Proposition 66 release date: Under Proposition 66, Mr. Garcia’s sentence would be reduced to a maximum of five years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, would be eligible for immediate release.
