



RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

Name: Francisco Gaile Guyton

Criminal history: Convicted in 1999 for failing to register as a sex offender. Previous convictions include forcible sodomy, forcible oral copulation, armed bank robbery, spousal abuse, battery, first- and second-degree burglary, and auto theft. He has repeatedly violated probation and parole.

Proposition 66 release date: Under Proposition 66, Mr. Guyton’s sentence would be reduced to a maximum of three years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, he would be eligible for immediate release.
