



# RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

**Name:** Glenn Cordova Lawag

**Criminal history:** Prior convictions for commercial burglary, reckless driving, contributing to the delinquency of a minor and sexually molesting his niece for five years, starting when she was five — including intercourse and oral copulation. Charged in 1999 with stalking a young woman he had worked with. In one call, told her: “I’m going to crawl through your window, and if you call the cops, I’m going to kill you, your cousin and everybody else.” In another call, told her: “I’m going to kill you and make your family watch.” While in jail awaiting trial, talked to his cellmate about ways to kill the victim. Convicted of solicitation of murder, at which time stalking and criminal threat charges were dismissed. Now serving 25 years to life.

**Proposition 66 release date:** Under Proposition 66, Mr. Lawag’s sentence would be reduced to approximately 10 years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, he would be eligible for release in 2006.
