



RELEASE REPORT

Proposition 66 removes several crimes from the “serious felony” strike list. Because it’s retroactive to 1994, thousands of inmates with long histories of serious and violent crime will have their sentences dramatically reduced and be back on the street. Here’s just one example.

Name: Kenneth Parnell

Criminal history: Convicted in 1980 of kidnapping two boys. One of his victims included Steven Staynor, who he sexually assaulted for more than seven years. Served five years in prison, paroled in 1985. Record includes three convictions for kidnapping and molesting young boys. Arrested again in 2003 for trying to buy a four-year-old boy in Berkeley for \$500. Convicted of three felonies — attempted child stealing, attempting to buy a human being and solicitation to commit kidnapping. Now serving 25 years to life.

Proposition 66 release date: Under Proposition 66, Mr. Parnell’s sentence would be reduced to a maximum of four years. Because of time served and “good time” credits, he would be eligible for release within weeks.
